


Merchant's House Museum

The Merchant's House Museum is New York City's only family home preserved intact from the 19th century and Greenwich Village's only historic house museum. A rowhouse built in 1832, it is among the finest surviving examples of late-Federal and Greek Revival architecture of the period. Home to prosperous merchant Seabury Tredwell and family from 1835 to 1933, the landmark house, which has been a museum open to the public since 1936, reflects in its original textiles, furniture, and decorative arts the lifestyle of a typical New York City upper-middle-class family of the last century.

Hours: Sunday through Thursday, 1 to 4 p.m. Group tours by appointment.

Admission: Free for members, \$3 for the public.

Parents are encouraged to introduce their children to the holiday traditions of Old New York with a tour of the house, decorated in 19th-century splendor. Refreshments. A Child's Christmas in Wales. This play written by Dylan Thomas is performed by Dudley Stone and friends.

By Subway: IRT: Lexington Avenue local #6 to Astor Place. Walk South on Lafayette Street to 4th Street and walk 1/2 block East. BMT: Local R or N to 8th Street. Walk South on Broadway to East 4th Street and walk 1 1/2 blocks East. IND: D or F to Broadway/ Lafayette. Walk North on Lafayette for 3 blocks, then East 1/2 block.

By Bus: Bus #M5 to Broadway and 4th Street. Walk East 1 1/2 blocks; Lexington-Third Avenue Bus #M102 to East 4th Street, walk West 1/2 block; Bus #M1 to Broadway and 8th Street, walk South on Broadway to East 4th Street and 1 1/2 blocks East.
